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NCHS STAFF RESEARCH LIBRARY

The Staff Research Library (SRL) which serves the National Center for Health Statistics is located at 6525 Belcrest Road, Hyattsville, MD. The SRL was established in 1977 to provide on site resources in statistics, epidemiology, public health and general medicine. The library subscribes to approximately 230 print journals and offers a reference collection of approximately 900 volumes and a circulating collection of 700 volumes. There are two full time information specialists and one part time librarian providing a full range of information services, including reference, interlibrary loan, a bimonthly acquisitions list, a biweekly guide to library resources, and a bibliography of statistical literature selected from the SRL journal collection. A variety of health-related databases are available for end-user searching. In addition, the SRL staff has access to additional databases to perform literature searches in non-health related areas.

Tours of the library are available as well as individual instruction for using electronic resources. The SRL is open to the public Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. For more information, please call 301-458-4775.

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BREASTFEEDING

Breastfeeding is defined as the feeding of human breast milk to provide for the natural nutritional needs of infants. Research shows that breastfeeding benefits both mothers and infants. Some of these benefits include protection against acute illness, long-term health protection, a special mother-infant interaction, and savings in health care costs. Early detection is important since childhood depression can lead to the later development of major depressive episodes or suicidal behavior. NURSING SHORTAGE

Nurses are the backbone of a quality health care system. The community-based model of health care delivery, with its emphasis on patient education and preventive health care, relies heavily on nursing services. At the present time, the nursing workforce is aging and many nurses are retiring. In addition, enrollment in nursing programs has dropped consistently over the past 5 years. Fewer than one in ten nurses is under 30 years old. By 2010 there will be a shortage of registered nurses. The Bureau of Health Professions, HRSA, is working to meet the nursing workforce needs by educating nurses as primary practitioners in needed specialties, increasing the diversity of this workforce, and supporting enrollment in baccalaureate nursing programs with education grants.

WOMEN AND SMOKING CESSATION

Recent studies show that women may have less success than men in quitting smoking. Some reasons for this include: Nicotine replacement therapy may not be as effective for women as it is for men. Women smokers are more fearful than men of gaining a lot of weight if they quit. Medications to aid smoking cessation are not currently recommended for pregnant women. A woman's menstrual cycle affects tobacco withdrawal symptoms and responses to anti-smoking drugs may vary by cycle phase. NIDA is sponsoring research to help women with smoking cessation.
