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**The Parklawn Health Library becomes the HHS Health Services Research Library**

As part of the reorganization of the Public Health Service, the Parklawn Health Library (PHL) was originally established in 1969 as the HSMHA Library and served as the headquarters library for the Health Services and Mental Health Services Administration (HSMHA). When HSMHA was abolished in the early 1970s, the library's name was changed to the Parklawn Health Library but it continued to serve the reorganized components of HSMHA. Over the years, PHL expanded to include the NCHS Staff Research Library (SRL), the NIDA and NIMH libraries, and the AHRQ Information Resources Center (IRC). In an effort to consolidate library services within HHS, PHL recently became a branch of the National Institutes of Health Library. The IRC remained with AHRQ while the SRL became a branch of the CDC Information Center. As a result of this transfer, PHL received a new name which is the HHS Health Services Research Library (HSRL). Its phone numbers and location remain the same.

Many older patients may start self-medicating instead of seeking professional help. In addition, the mixing of medications can cause symptoms which are similar to mental disorders. SAMHSA, FDA, and AoA will release public education materials to warn older Americans of the hazards of mixing certain prescription medications and alcohol.

## DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY

Developmental disability refers to a severe, chronic disability of an individual which is attributed to a mental or physical impairment or a combination of mental or physical impairments and is manifested before age 22. These impairments cause substantial functional limitations in three or more of the following major life activities: self care, receptive and expressive language, learning, mobility, self

direction, capacity for independent living, and economic self sufficiency. Many individuals with developmental disabilities require special care, treatment, or other services for either extended periods of time or throughout their lives. ACF sponsors programs that address the needs, strengths, and abilities of developmentally disabled individuals.
